## INTERCOLLEGIATE FENCING

Harvard the Winner in a Well-Contested Tournament. Naval Cadets a Point Behind the Lead-

ers and a Point Ahead of Cornell -Columbia Ranks Fourth.

Harvard fencers won a hard-fought contest in the intercollegiate tournament held

at the Racquet and Tennis Club Saturday

afternoon and evening, while the individual championship went to A. E. Wieland of Cornell. The teams entered were those of Columbia, Harvard, Yale, United States Naval Academy, and Cornell. There were three men, on each team and as each man contested every other there were ninety bouts.

The afternoon contests resulted evenly for all except Yale, who took a rear seat at the outset and kept it throughout the tournament. For general team work Harvard easily ranked first, but for brilliant individual effort Ware of Columbia and Tamura, the little Japanese fencer from Annapolis, were the favorites. De Diaz of Harvard, who holds the amateur fencing championship of

America, was hampered by a badly injured hand. This is the first time that five colleges have entered in this tournament, only four having contested in previous years. Yale, the fifth college, entered at the last moment, and it was understood that her men lacked both training and experience. The pluck her men displayed, however, in fighting desperately for every bout, elicited more admiration than their fencing.
