

# FENCING HONORS GO TO WEST POINT

## Cadets Capture Intercollegiate Championship for Second Successive Year.

### NAVY TEAM DEFEATS YALE

#### Cocroft and Sears of the Military Team Tie, with One Defeat Each, for Individual Title.

West Point won the intercollegiate fencing championship yesterday by a total of 29 bouts won to 4 lost. The Naval Academy was second with 21 victories and 12 defeats, and Yale came third with 16 victories and 17 defeats. The final contests were held last night in the Squadron Armory, Madison Avenue and Ninety-fourth Street, drawing a large crowd, including several hundred women. In the afternoon the first lot of bouts in the final series was fenced at the New York Turn Verein, Lexington Avenue and Eighty-fifth Street, where the preliminaries were held on the preceding evening.

R. Cocroft and R. Sears of the Army tied for the individual championship honors, as each went through the two days' play with only one defeat, Cocroft losing last night after a hard bout to F. S. R. Brandt of the Navy, while Sears was defeated in the preliminaries by Smith of Yale. The third Army member, Sohlberg, was defeated twice, by Knox of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Brandt of the Navy. The winning team is the same that represented the Military Academy last year when the West Point cadets captured the title from the Naval Academy. Yale gave the Navy a hard fight for second place up to last night, being only one bout behind the Annapolis cadets when the final series began, but they succeeded in winning only a single bout in the Squadron A contests. The Boston fencers from the Institute of Technology, the fourth team to qualify in the preliminary bouts, scored nine victories. The teams and results of the day's bouts:

## COAST ARTILLERY MEET.

### Bellars Beats Crack Field in Three-Mile Even in Brooklyn Armory.

Fred G. Bellars of the New York Athletic Club won the three-mile invitation race at the thirty-second annual games of the Coast Artillery Corps, Thirteenth District, held at their armory in Brooklyn last night.

George Bonhag of the Irish-American Athletic Club was down on the programme for this race, but failed to start. Bellars, Kramer of the Acorn Athletic Club, and Bailey of the New York Athletic Club, had the race between them for the last 200 yards, and they crossed the tape as named.

The Acorn Athletic Club first team won the one-mile interclub relay race. Lieut. H. L. Hillman started from scratch in the 220-yard hurdle handicap, and won from C. C. Suggles, who was on the 10-yard mark in 0:27 1-5, which is one-fifth of a second behind the armory record made by him in 1905. Summary:
