

WEST POINT AND CORNELL TIE

Each Fencing Team Wins Eighteen Preliminary Bouts at West Point.

WEST POINT, N. Y., March 25.—In the preliminary bouts to eliminate one team from participating in the finals of the Intercollegiate Fencing tourney to be held in New York, March 31, and April 1, Harvard, Cornell, Yale, and West Point crossed foils here to-night. Fifty-four bouts were fenced and at the finish it was found that West Point team had tied with Cornell, each having won 18 bouts and were, therefore, each entitled to a place in the big meet. The finals also showed that Yale and Harvard had tied each having won 9 bouts and since one must be eliminated it was decided that Yale and Harvard fence nine more bouts.

Harvard Winning the Fence.

McLaughlin of Harvard, did the best individual work and won 8 out of nine bouts. Wilbur of the Army and Espandola of Cornell, came next with seven bouts each, and Roose of Cornell, and Rayner of Army, received third place with six bouts apiece out of nine fenced.

The teams were: Yale, Ross, Ransom, and Saunders. Harvard: McLaughlin, Hunt, and Wilbur. Cornell: Espandola, Roose, and Allison. West Point: Wilbur, Anderson, and Rayner. The summary:
