Put Out of Individual Race as College Fencing Finals Get Under Way at the Astor.

TWO TEAMS TIED IN FOILS

Cornell and Army Each Have Three Victories and No Defeats—Yale Shows Way With Sabre.

Intercollegiate fencing championships with three weapons got under way at the Hotel Astor yesterday. One defending titleholder was eliminated, for Rawson Bennett, Navy's ace with the épêe and winner in that division last year, failed to perform in championship fashion and passed out of the picture with five victories and six defeats. Sabre and épèe bouts were held yes-

terday on three strips in the Belvedere Room and the few remaining matches. which will decide the individual and team winners in each weapon, will be held tonight. The foils bouts started last night and will be concluded with tonight's matches. The teams that competed yesterday

came through the semi-final rounds that were held in three divisions, Northern,, Central and Southern, last month. Cornell Beats Yale.

In spite of Captain Dernell Every's three victories in the folls last night against Cornell, the Elis were defeated, 5-4, and the Ithacans went into a tie for the lead with the Army, with three victories and no defeats.
