Sweeps All Three Weapons in Qualifying Test for National Event at Navy.

HARVARD AND YALE SCORE

Cornell, Army and N. Y. U. Also Register in Tourney—Every of Yale Stars.

Special to The New York Times. ANNAPOLIS, Md., March 24.—Columbia was a strong first this afternoon with all weapons in the semifinals of the Southern Division of the Intercollegiate Fencing Association, taking the leading place with foils, sabres and épée.

The Naval Academy was second with foils and sabres and Princetor was next to Columbia with the épée.

The first and second team with each weapon will enter the fina of the Intercollegiate Association which takes place in New York City April 5 and 6. The individual contestants in the finals will be the leaders in all three of the semifinals, the ten highest with the foils and the eight leaders with sabres and epee.

The teams of Ohio State and Hamilton College failed to qualify, but both will send individuals to the meet to compete as a result of today's bouts. Army and Cornell have individuals qualified in all three weapons.
