

Roommates Score at Fencing As Did Uncles, Also Roommates

Two roommates at West Point scored high with the épée and foil at the intercollegiate fencing championships at the Hotel Astor yesterday. They were following in the footsteps of their uncles, who also had been roommates at West Point before them and who had won high honors with the same weapons. The cadets were John Hinrichs, nephew of Major Francis W. Honeycutt, considered one of the greatest of the army's fencers, and William M. Breckinridge, nephew of Colonel W. Scott Breckinbridge. Major Honeycutt was a member of the American Olympic team, was national champion and fenced for America in international matches. Colonel Breckinridge was twice national champion and an Olympic fencer. Cadet Breckinridge is also a nephew of Colonel Henry Breckinridge, former Assistant Secretary of War, who is captain of the 1928 Olympic team.
