COLLEGE FENCING WILL START TODAY

Navy to Defend Three-Weapon Crown in Event at N. Y. U. School of Education

A field of twelve teams will start action today in the Intercollegiate Fencing Association's forty-seventh annual championship tournament at the N. Y. U. School of Educa-

tion gymnasium.

The midshipmen of Navy will be on hand in an attempt to retain the five titles their fencers won last year. Navy will be defending honors in the foils and épée as well as in the three-weapon team competition. Annapolis swordsmen also were successful last year in annexing the individual foils and saber crowns. Abraham Campo of the Philip-

pines is returning to defend his saber championship, but neither Vincent de Poix, Navy winner in foils. nor Salvatore Manzo, Army's victor with the épée, will be present when the two-day competition starts this morning.

Last year's only other victorious team was Columbia, winner with the saber. Other squads entered are City College, Cornell, Hamilton, Harvard, M. I. T., Pennsylvania, Princeton, Yale, Army and N. Y. U.

Some of the outstanding competitors who will take part are Alan Rorick, Army, who lost to Campo in the 1939 saber fence-off; Gordon Wallis, Columbia; Silvio Giolito, N. Y. U. foils ace; Arthur Tauber,

N. Y. U. freshman intercollegiate champion in 1939; Dan Appelton, Navy; Rex Auchincloss, Yale, and Berwin Cole, C. C. N. Y. captain.
