

TEN COLLEGE TEAMS IN FENCING TODAY

New York University, the defender, and nine other teams will compete in the sixty-fifth annual Intercollegiate Fencing Association championship starting today. The two-day event will be held at N. Y. U.'s Alumni Gymnasium on University Heights.

The Violets captured three-weapon honors, won the foil and épée team laurels and shared the saber team title with Columbia a year ago.

The Lions, recent winners of the Ivy League crown, halted

the Violets' dual meet streak of thirty-five during the season. However, the Lions bowed to Navy a week ago.

Columbia, N. Y. U. and Navy are rated as favorites in the championship.

A new trophy will be awarded this year in honor of the late Cornell coach, Georges L. Cointe. Cornell alumni and undergraduates have contributed to its creation. It will be voted by the coaches to the contestant who "best demonstrates qualities of sportsmanship."

In addition to N. Y. U., Columbia, Navy and Cornell, the participants will be Yale, Harvard, Princeton, City College, Penn and Rutgers.
