N.Y.U. Wins in Foils, Penn in Epee

A few hours after relinquishing the épée crown to Penn yesterday, New York University won the foils title in the Intercollegiate Fencing Association championships.

At home in their Alumni Gymnasium at Heights, a new scene for the sixty-five-year-old tourney, the Violets moved ahead in the overfor three-weapon all race supremacy. Losing only two foils bouts in twenty-seven Les Ault, Columbia, 6-3; Jon Heilbrunn, Hugo Castello's Violets gained 25 points to add to the 17 they had picked up in the épée. N. Y. U. has held the threeweapon title for the past five years.
