**Beavers Get 30 Points, Navy  
28—Axelrod of Winners  
Annexes Foil Honors**

ANNAPOLIS, Md., April 3—Abram Cohen, winning twelve of his thirteen saber bouts in the preliminaries, tonight boosted City College of New York into the National Collegiate Athletic Association fencing championship. Eighty-four fencers from twenty-nine colleges competed in the fourth annual N. C. A. A. meet at the Naval Academy.

robins, the Beavers had 30 points, two ahead of Navy, to capture the Yale Trophy for the team title. Team points were scored on individual bouts won with each weapon.

Cohen was one of eight men qualifying for the final round robin with the saber.

His team-mate, Albert Axelrod, moved into the finals with the foil with a sweep of thirteen bouts in another preliminary round robin. Bob Kaplan of New York University, dethroned by Axelrod last month as Eastern intercollegiate foils champion, also moved into the finals by winning all twelve of his preliminary foil bouts.

Gordon Groh of Northwestern led the épée event with eleven victories in thirteen preliminary bouts.

Navy took two individual championships, while City College took the third.

Jim Day of Navy added the national title to his Eastern intercollegiate saber championship by defeating Ham Millard of Cornell. Gerald Bruce of Detroit was third and Richard Watson of Wayne fourth.

Bill Bryan picked up the second Navy crown by upsetting Richard Bowman of Army to whom he lost the Eastern epee title a few weeks ago. John Hughes of Princeton placed third and Don Thompson of Chicago fourth.

Axelrod went on to take the foils final. Kaplan was second, William Schuster of Army, third, and Art Cohen of Chicago, fourth.
