

# N.Y.U. GAINS TITLE IN N.C.A.A. FENCING

Rosenberg's Epee Victories  
Help Violets Outscore  
Columbia, 65 to 64

DETROIT, March 23—N. Y. U. won the thirteenth annual National Collegiate fencing championship today by piling up 65 points to beat the runner-up, Columbia, by a point.

The Violets, who dethroned Illinois as champions, were in third place after yesterday's opening session. They didn't move into first place until their Paul Rosenberg upset Jim Woods of Navy in one of the last épée matches of the meet.

Columbia had been leading N. Y. U. by 3 points after yesterday's competition. But Bernie Balaban won the sabre, Rosenberg added points in the épée, Al Peredo did the same in the foils and the Violets came on to take their third N. C. A. A. championship in fencing.

Wisconsin and Navy tied for third with 60 points each. Then

came Illinois with 55, Pennsylvania and Yale with 54 each, Princeton with 53, Notre Dame with 52 and Wayne with 50.

Bruce Davis of Wayne was the individual champion with twenty-six victories and one defeat in the fells.

In the épée, Columbia's Jim Margolis was the winner with an over-all mark of 26 and three.

Frank Tyrrell of Wisconsin finished second to Balaban in the sabre. Tyrrell was voted "the Collegiate title with Columbia in 1954 and won the championship outright in 1947. In 1950 and 1952, the Violets were second.

N. Y. U. shared the National fencer of the year" by the coaches on the basis of skill, sportsmanship and conduct during the two-day event.
