NORTHRIDGE, Calif., March 31—The performance of Mike Gaylor in foil catapulted New York University into a sizable lead today after the second day's competition in the 23d National Collegiate fencing championships.

Gaylor won nine bouts in the San Fernando Valley State College gymnasium to give the Violets undisputed leadership in weapon going into tomorrow's final round. Over-all N. Y. U. has accu-

mulated a two-day total of 51 points, 8 better than Air Force Academy and Pennsylvania, tied for second. Next were Navy, with 42 points, and Columbia, with 40. The pressure was on Gaylor

Ŷ. U.'s saber star, Paul Apostol, lost three times in the morning sessions. The defending N.C.A.A. champion was beaten by John Swanson of Air Force, Paul Profeta of Harvard and Frank Emihovich of Columbia. One of the strongest performances was by Todd Makler of

Pennsylvania, who captured eight saber bouts. George Masin continued his sterling performance for N. Y. U.
