

N.Y.U. Leads Penn By Point in Fencing For N.C.A.A. Title

SOUTH BEND, Ind., March 20—New York University forged into the lead today after the semifinal round of the National Collegiate Athletic Association's fencing championships at the Athletic and Convocation Center of Notre Dame.

The Violets have 43 points, one more than the University of Pennsylvania, the defending champion. Columbia and Navy are tied for third place with 38 points and Harvard is fifth with 32.

For the Violets, who are seeking a record eighth N.C.A.A. crown, Jeff Tishman and Walter Krause captured 10 of 11 bouts in saber and foil respectively. Wayne Krause had an 8-3 won-lost record in épée.
