

N.Y.U. Leads Advance In N.C.A.A. Fencing

SOUTH BEND, Ind., March 24 (AP) —New York University, the defending champion, and 10 other teams moved through the round of the National Collegiate Athletic Association fencing today. However, previously undefeated Penn State was one of the teams in the field of 62 that was knocked out.

Each team could enter only one person in the saber, foil and epee categories. The field of 133 entries was then divided into six pools with pool members competing on a round-robin basis and pool winners advancing. A school must advance fencers in all three categories to stay in contention for the team title.

The schools still in competition beside N.Y.U. are Columbia, Cornell, Harvard, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Pennsylvania, St. John's, Wayne State and Yale.
