Meet The Coaches



Head Coach Andy Ma

First Season ♦ Beijing Sports University '85 ♦ Ohio State '91

Andy Ma has large shoes to fill as he enters his first season as the head coach of men's and women's fencing. Ma replaces David Micahnik, who finished his Hall

of Fame career after the 2008-09 season with multiple NCAA individual champions and 22 Ivy League titles.

Ma brings his own level of success to Penn after spending the last 15 years as President and Head Fencing Coach at the Fencing Academy of South Jersey in Cherry Hill. During Ma's tenure, the program has trained eight US National Fencing Team members, five in saber, three in foil, six national champions and one world champion. Seven of his South Jersey fencers have competed at the University of Pennsylvania, and 20 have gone on to Ivy League fencing programs.

Since 1997, Ma has also produced more than 200 medalists in United States Fencing Association (USFA) national and NAC competitions, World Cup competitions, and World Championships.

Internationally, Ma coached the United States Cadet Saber team from 2003 to 2008, and in both 2005 and 2008

he was selected Coach of the Year by the U.S. Olympic Committee. President of the USFA's South Jersey Division, he is a certified USFA fencing director and earned the highest competitive rating of "A" by the USFA in Saber in 1992.

In addition to his work at the Fencing Academy, Ma served two stints as Micahnik's assistant coach at Penn, the first from 1994-96, and the second from 2005-06.

During his first stint, Penn won the Ivy League Women's Team Championship twice, in 1994 and 1995, as he trained a first-team men's saber All-America and a second-team men's foil All-America.

Ma was also an

assistant coach at Ohio State University from 1989-91, helping the Buckeyes win the Men's and Women's Big Ten titles in 1990-91, and from 1985-88 he was fencing coach at the Beijing (China) Sports University where he helped develop China's junior national saber champion who later competed at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain.

As a competitor, Ma was a two-time National Saber champion of the Chinese Fencing Association (1985, 1988) and a two-time Chinese Intercollegiate Saber champion (1983, 1985). He also won Ohio's saber title during his stint at OSU.

Ma holds B.A. degrees in Fencing and Physical Education from the Beijing (China) Sports University, as well as an Educational Psychology degree from the Beijing (China) Teachers University. He also has a master's in Sports Psychology from Ohio State.

Iosif Vitebskiy enters his 12th season as the assistant coach of the University of Pennsylvania fencing program, following one of the most successful seasons in school history. In addition to catpuring the Ivy League men's title Vitebskiy coached four different players to All-America honors and had eight participate in the national championships.

In 2007-08, he worked with Penn's four All-Americans, including extensive work with Ron Berkowsky, Penn's first-ever four-time All-America.

Vitebskiy helped the 2003-04 women's squad claim its 10th Ivy title in program history and finish the season ranked fourth by the USFCA. Under Micahnik's and Vitebskiy's tutelage, the Quakers' women's team also made history at the Intercollegiate Fencing Association (IFA) championships at the end of February, claiming its first-ever IFA title in 2004.

His vast knowledge and experience made an immediate impact in 1998-99, as he helped guide the men's team to its first Ivy League title since 1983, while the men's and women's teams combined for a seventh-place finish at the NCAA Championships.

Prior to his appointment at Penn, Vitebskiy served for 10 years (1988-1998) as the director of the school for high sport achievements at the State University of Ukraine. Before that, he was head coach of the Ukraine Republic National Team for 13 years, where he guided five epee fencers to national and Olympic championships.

A graduate of the Kiev State University with a degree in physical culture and sport, Vitebskiy was a member of both the Soviet Union and Ukraine national teams. A 19-time national championship medalist—10 gold, six silver and three bronze medals—Vitebskiy was a three-time winner of both the Soviet Union and the Europe Cup tournaments.

He is a former member of the USSR team that won three consecutive World Championships (1967-69) and earned a silver medal at the 1968 Olympic Games. In the summer of 1999, Vitebskiy won the gold medal in the Veteran 60 Men's Epee at the Summer National Championships in Charlotte, N.C.

Vitebskiy and his wife, Emma reside in the northeast section of Philadelphia. They have two sons, Dmitriy and Alex.



Ben **Wieder**

Volunteer Assistant Coach 1st Season Penn C' 09

Former All-America Ben Wieder enters his first season as a member of the Penn coaching staff.

Wieder enters the coaching realm following an impressive four-year career with the Red and Blue. Last season, Wieder served as captain for a Penn squad which went a perfect 17-0 in the regular season, culminating in the school's first Ivy League championship since 2003. The Quakers also won the IFA team championship, as well as the IFA three weapon title, IFA sabre title, IFA Epee title and Penn's first ever combined six weapon title.

An All-America honoree in 2009, Wieder is also a three-time NCAA Championships qualifier, and three-time Academic All-Ivy. He graduated Magna Cum Laude from Penn in 2009 with a B.A. in Physics and Astronomy and is currently working as a researcher in the physics department at Penn.



2008-09 Review

A Season To Remember...

Penn fencing affirmed its position as one of the country's elite programs over the course of the 2008-09 season. In what turned out to be the final season for Hall of Fame coach David Micahnik, the 2008-09 campaign was one of the most successful in recent memory.

Following a perfect 15-0 mark in dual meets, including a win over eventual national champion Penn State, the men's fencing team entered the Ivy League Championship as the favorite. The Red and Blue didn't disappoint as the team captured the program's 15th Ivy League title and first since 2003. For their efforts, seven men were honored as All-Ivy performers. Juniors Jonathan Berkowsky and Andrew Bielen as well as freshman Zane Grodman were first-team All-Ivy, while freshmen Alex Simmons and Vidur Kapur, senior Ben Wieder and sophomore Jacob Wischnia were second team honorees.



On the women's side, four different athletes were named All-Ivy, as sophomore Danielle Kamis, and a trio of freshman in Dominika Franciszkowicz, Mia Howell and Laura Paragano were all named to the second team as the Quakers finished short of the Ivy League title.

However, In the IFA championships, neither the men nor the women would be denied as the two combined to win the IFA six-weapon trophy. The first such title in school history for the Red and Blue, it is awarded to the team which compiles the most wins across the three contested weapons for both the men's and the women's competition. In the men's competition, the Quakers also won the men's combined three-weapon title (its tenth title in program history), men's saber and epee. The women brought home hardware as well, as the women's saber squad tied for first, earning their second consecutive co-championship.

Penn's success continued at the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regionals, where eight fencers qualified for the NCAA Championships. The list was highlighted by Berkowsky, who finished first in the region in saber. Bielen, Kapur and Wieder also earned entry into the national tournament that day while Grodman earned an at-large selection later. For the women, Franciszkowicz, Kamis, Paragano and Stephanie Wheeler also qualified.

At the 2009 NCAA Championships at Penn State, Penn finished the tournament in seventh place with 103 total victories. While the finish was the same the 2007-08 season the team had 11 more victories than the previous season. Four Quakers also received All-America honors for their performance. Berkowsky was a second team selection while Wieder was an honorable mention for the men. On the women's side, Franciszkowicz and Wheeler were both named honorable mention All-America.



Did You Know?

- Nine Penn alumni, faculty members and trustees signed the Declaration of Independence.
- Eleven alumni, faculty members, and trustees signed the U.S. Constitution.
- The Heisman Trophy is named after former Penn football coach and Law graduate John Heisman.
- Dr. Judith Rodin, CW'66 was Penn's seventh president (1994-2004) and the first female president in the Ivy League.
- John B. Taylor, College 1907 and Veterinary School 1908, was the first black athlete to win a gold medal for the U.S. (track at the 1908 Olympics).
- Penn is the only school in the country to have at least one representative on every U.S. summer Olympics team since 1900.
- The record nine gold medals Penn students and alumni won at the 1900 Olympics has never been matched by another school.

Penn Traditions

Quaker Mascot

Penn's sports teams are nicknamed the Quakers after the religion adopted by William Penn, who established Pennsylvania as a Quaker province. Today, we see the Quaker at Penn football and basketball games. In the 1920s, a proposal was made to change the Quaker mascot to the Penguin, but the students found the animal was too weak as a representative.



Penn Songs

"The Red and the Blue" is probably the most well-known Penn song, and is sung at the end of many Penn events. It was written in 1896 and places the origins of Penn's colors as a combination of those of the best of her rivals. Arm motions accompany the song's refrain. Other popular songs include "Fight On, Pennsylvania!" and "Drink a Highball."

The Button

Created by Claes Oldenberg and installed in front of Van Pelt Library in 1981, the Button is 16 feet in diameter, weighs 5,000 pounds, and is cast in reinforced aluminum. Oldenberg once told the

Philadelphia Inquirer that "the Split represents the Schuylkill. It divides the button into four parts — for William Penn's original Philadelphia squares."

Spring Fling

Since the 70s, Spring Fling has been the ultimate student festival at Penn. Beginning in 1972, with an attendance between ten and fifteen thousand, students descend onto the Quad, Hill Square, College Green, and Wynn Commons to dance, eat, party, and enjoy a day full of surprises. Each Spring Fling consists of a carnival with games and events, a concert hosting high-profile bands, and the Quad concerts, which showcase some of the hottest local bands and performers.

Hey Day

In 1916, Hey Day was established as a "Moving-Up" celebration - a formal day to mark the advancement of each class. In recent decades, Hey Day, which is unique to Penn, represents the official passage of the junior class to senior status and is characterized by thousands of marching students parading around campus sporting fake straw hats, red t-shirts and canes.


Come all ye loyal classmen now, in hall and campus through, Lift up your hearts and voices for the royal Red and Blue.

Toast Throwing

Toast throwing is one of the most unique sporting traditions in which crowds of Quakers fans perform as a sign of school pride. After the third quarter of home football games, fans unite in the singing of "Drink a Highball." As the last line is sung—"Here's a toast to dear old Penn"—the fans toss toasted bread to the sidelines. The act of throwing toast was adopted after alcohol was banned from the stadium in the 1970s. Students turned towards bread, and even bagels, so that they could continue to raise a "toast" to Penn.




Making History—Penn Eliminates Loans

Over the past three years ... Penn has moved aggressively to enhance its undergraduate financial aid programs, including the elimination of loans for students from families with income under \$50,000 in 2006, with that threshold increasing to \$60,000 in 2007.

Through these efforts, the number of students attending Penn has doubled in families below this income threshold. In addition, the benefit of these moves has been demonstrated through the increase in the number of no-loan packages from 31-percent to 49-percent of the grant-aided admitted freshman class. In addition, the new policies have decreased the average debt at graduation from \$20,927 in 2006 to \$18,800 in 2007, a decrease of 10-percent.

Effective for the 2009-10 academic year, a student admitted to Penn who is eligible to receive financial aid will no longer have to take on any loans to study at Penn.

With the enthusiastic support of the Penn Trustees, President Gutmann announced a bold new initiative to eliminate loans for all students eligible for financial aid, regardless of family income. Consequently, effective for the 2009-10 academic year, a student admitted to Penn who is eligible to receive financial aid will no longer have to take on any loans to study at Penn. This transformative initiative will continue Penn's commitment to lower- and lower-middle income students while also lifting the burden off of students from middle- and upper-middle income families, who typically have carried the greatest debt from higher education.



Financial Aid

We urge you not to let financial concerns deter you from applying to Penn. The University guarantees that any accepted student who matriculates with demonstrated financial need will receive a financial-aid package that meets the full extent of the student's need for a full four years.

- 55-percent of all undergraduates receive some form of financial aid, including grant, loan and work-study job.
- 40-percent of all undergraduates are eligible for needbased aid.
- This year Penn will award over \$102 million in grant aid
- Beginning in fall 2008, all undergraduate students not just entering freshmen – from families with calculated incomes under \$100,000 will receive no-loan aid packages.
 Families with incomes above that level will receive a 10percent reduction in need-based loans.
- Beginning in fall 2009, all undergraduate students eligible for financial aid will receive loan-free aid packages, regardless of family income level.
- This new initiative is the latest step in the University's goal to make a Penn education affordable and accessible to students from a wide spectrum of economic backgrounds. Penn currently spends more than \$90 million per year of its resources for grant aid to undergraduate students. When the new initiative is fully implemented, that figure will exceed \$110 million an increase of more than 20-percent.
- The new financial aid initiative is expected to benefit more than 40-percent of Penn's undergraduates. The University will finance this initiative largely through funds raised from its recently launched, five-year, \$3.5 billion "Making History" capital campaign, which includes a \$350 million goal for undergraduate financial aid endowment. During the silent phase of the campaign Penn raised over 400 new aid scholarships.
- Penn also recently launched a new outreach program targeting hundreds of schools and thousands of students from low and middle income families — who might never have considered applying to Penn — to let them know that if they can get accepted to Penn, they will receive a full financial aid package with no loans.

Sponsoring conference championships in a nation-leading 33 men's and women's sports, and averaging more than 35 varsity teams at each school, the Council of Ivy Group Presidents—known as the Ivy League—provides intercollegiate athletic opportunities for more men and women than any other conference in the country. All eight Ivy schools are among the Top 20 of NCAA Division I schools in number of sports offered for both men and women.

The Ivy League By the Numbers Since 2000, the Ivy League has...

- Produced NCAA individual champions in seven sports and NCAA team championships in four sports. The League has also captured national champions in the non-NCAA sports such as men's squash and men's rowing. All eight Ivy League schools have had at least one NCAA champion—individual or team—during this span.
- Amassed more than 100 All-Americans each year.
- Averaged more than a dozen Academic All-Americans each year, including an all-time high of 18 in 2006-07.
- Had 162 competitors at the four Olympic Games (2000, '02, '04 and '06). Those 162 have collected 53 medals, including 18 gold.

Steve Bilsky, W'71 Athletic Director

Now in his 16th year at his alma mater, Steve Bilsky has created a rich environment for student-athletes to thrive athletically and academically.

During his tenure, 77 Penn teams have earned conference championships in 21 different sports. Penn has been honored with more than 300 Academic All-Ivy honorees, 27 Ivy League Players of the Year, and 97 All-Americans.

To support that success, Bilsky has made efforts to secure the best facilities and coaching for Penn. Since raising \$800,000 in 1994, Penn Athletics has nearly quadrupled the athletic department's annual Weightman Fund, topping three million dollars in both 2007 and 2008. Through discreet fundraising drives, Penn Athletics has built or renovated more than 15 facilities. In terms of personnel, the department has received specific donations to endow nine head coaching positions as well as the Penn Relays directorship.

Bilsky has also raised Penn's profile nationally, as during his tenure the University has been the host institution for six NCAA Championships.

In 1996, Bilsky formed the Penn Athletic Hall of Fame; a total of six classes have been inducted, the latest in May 2008.

Before returning to Penn in 1994, Bilsky was executive director of the Department of Athletics and Recreation at George Washington University. Prior to that, he was assistant director of athletics at Penn (1979-83). His educational background includes a Master's degree in counseling psychology from the Oregon in 1975, and a bachelor's in economics from Penn's Wharton School in 1971.

A basketball standout, Bilsky was a three-time All-Ivy guard and captained a Penn team that was arguably the greatest in program history—in 1970-71, the Quakers went undefeated through the regular season and NCAA Tournament before finally losing to Villanova in the Eastern Regional final. Bilsky is a member of the Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Fame (1988), the Penn Athletic Hall of Fame (1998), and the Philadelphia Jewish Sports Hall of Fame (2002).

Bilsky's wife, Sue, is a 1975 graduate of the Penn College of Arts and Sciences and the Graduate School of Education. She also holds a Master's degree from Wharton. Their son Jeff recently graduated from Penn, while daughter Katie enrolled at Penn in 2007.

Penn Connects Penn Connects Penn Connects, the Campus Development Planning Study for the University

Target: Spring 2010!

Penn Connects, the Campus Development Planning Study for the University of Pennsylvania was submitted by Sasaki Associates in June 2006. The plan acknowledges the unprecedented opportunity to transform the Penn campus in response to the acquisition of property along the Schuylkill River. This campus expansion of contiguous land will enable the University, for the first time in history, to establish a major physical presence along the Schuylkill River corridor, create new gateways to the campus from the city, and establish new connections with the surrounding communities.


In terms of Penn Athletics, the planning study aims to create a signature new urban park to include sports and recreation fields east of Franklin Field on the site of the existing Bower Field and the surface parking areas of the postal lands. This "once in a generation" opportunity will also enable Penn Athletics to address many of its programmatic needs, as well as key priorities that may arise over the next several years.

Though still in the planning stages and subject to change, Penn Athletics intends to create the Franklin Field Pavilion to house existing named spaces as well as some new construction and renovation of existing spaces. The north side of the stadium, inside the arcades, would include the Avery Blake

Lacrosse Complex, the George A. Munger Complex, a new 15,000 square foot intercollegiate varsity weight room, a new recreational fitness center to complement the state-of-the-art Pottruck Health and Fitness Center built in 2003, retail space, a renovated and enhanced training room and locker facilities. In addition, there are plans to build two synthetic turf fields and two smaller grass fields (all for intercollegiate and recreational use), a new softball-specific stadium, outdoor tennis complex and a seasonal air structure that will serve as an indoor practice facility that can be raised and lowered during the winter months.

Another major change on the landscape of the athletics area of campus is the creation of the Palestra Green; a green quadrangle in front of the Palestra and adjacent to Franklin Field that would be part of the urban park extending along the banks of the river. The tennis courts, currently outside the Palestra, will be moved to a new outdoor tennis center on the existing Bower Field.

These plans hope to provide for a series of new public gathering and circulation spaces in the Palestra and Franklin Field area that serve to link the newly acquired property, campus and community.
